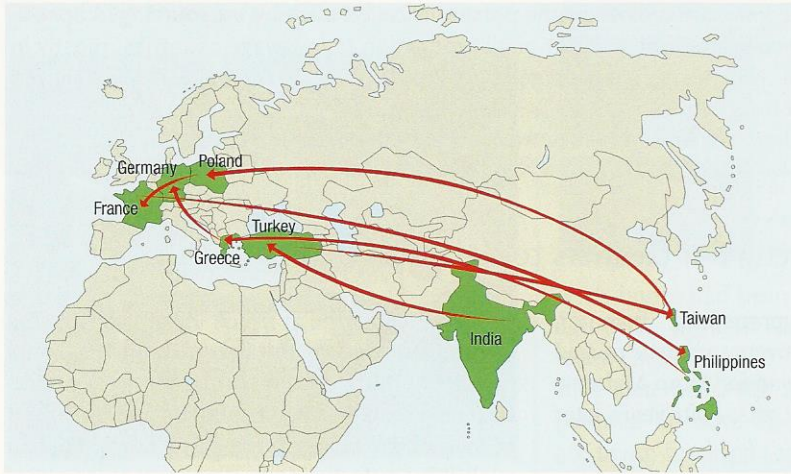


# Jeans – The Journey of Blue Jeans in a Global, Liberalised World
